## Poster Project Book Report

Create a poster based on a book that you have read this marking period.

The poster should resemble a movie poster. <u>Students should use 11 x 17 poster board or paper.</u> **5 pts** 

#### The poster should include

- the title of the book (underlined and correctly capitalized) **5pts**
- the author, **5pts**
- the publisher, 5 pts
- large picture or collage showing an interesting part of the book, 15pts
  - The poster and picture should **NOT** be based on the front cover of the book.
- written description in fifty words or more summarizing the story, and in your own words why somebody \ else might enjoy the book, **30pts**

# It is important that you proof read your work before you turn the final product in. With that said, here is the rubric for errors for written work. You can earn less than 30 pts if you are not careful

- **30 pts**. Error free or only 1-2 minor errors (grammar, spelling. usage, sentence structure)
- **20 pts.** 3-5 errors
- **10 pts**. 5-9
- **5 pts**. 10+ errors

- Have all the parts mentioned above arranged on your poster in a pleasing, eye catching fashion, and present your poster to the class **20 pts**
